

Project Management, Master of Professional Studies Curriculum

PPM 610 Project Management Fundamentals

Project Management Fundamentals prepares participants for hands-on, real world project management activities. Participants will acquire knowledge necessary for applying project management skills and tasks related to planning, scheduling, budgeting, communications, risk management and project closure.

PPM 612 Project Planning

This course will outline the steps taken to complete the planning process and to create the components of the project management plan that will serve as the guide to project execution.

PPM 613 Agile Project Management

Provides an understanding of how new Agile principles and practices are changing the landscape of project management. Designed to give project managers fresh new insight to successfully blend Agile and traditional project management principles and practices to fit any business and project situation

PPM 615 Schedule Development and Management

This course guides the student through the process of planning, developing, and controlling the project schedule.

PPM 628 Opportunity and Risk Management

This course addresses the risk management knowledge area with an approach that provides the project management professional the ability to minimize the threats of risk while maximizing the positive impacts of opportunities.

PPM 629 Procurement and Stakeholder Management

This course discusses both project procurement and stakeholder management. Procurement management addresses the processes necessary to purchase or acquire products, services or results from outside the performing organization. Our examination of stakeholder management includes the processes required to identify the people affected by the project and to develop appropriate strategies for engaging these stakeholders in project decisions and execution.

PPM 632 Organizational Behavior and Leadership

Examine traditional and contemporary leadership theories and styles, gain an understanding of approaches that can provide direction and motivation to project teams.

PPM 634 Project Communications Management

This course will equip the project manager to achieve the goal of getting the right people, the right information, at the right time and ensuring that the key stakeholders are kept updated.

PPM 646 Global Projects and Virtual Project Management

This course examines approaches to effectively manage large-scale projects which are primarily comprised of virtual teams that have the additional challenges of being multi-cultural, overcoming language barriers, and collaborating across different time zones.

PPM 711 Capstone in Project Management

Making use of case study examples, students will develop a comprehensive project management plan demonstrating expertise in the (10) knowledge areas across the (5) phases of the project lifecycle.
